The team will be visiting Parliament on National Stop Smoking Day and they will be accompanied by local representatives of HNY, including school children and a teacher. • There has been a great response to the HNY Health Equity Fellowship Programme with 29 Fellows who have been accepted on to the one-year programme. Multiple sectors are represented, including VCSE, mental health and acute trusts, primary care, local authority and commissioning. • Following the presentation on our Children and Young People Migrant Experience item the members have agreed that there will be significant crossover with emerging inclusion health

work. A mapping exercise is taking place across the ICS which will need to reflect the multiple assets in HNY serving this cohort as well as identified gaps.
