Council unanimously opposed to reduced service at Scunthorpe hospital

At a North Lincolnshire Council meeting councillors voted unanimously to object to proposals to move some services out of Scunthorpe General Hospital – leaving local people with the long trek to Grimsby to receive treatment or visit friends and family.

The council also raised the prospect of launching a judicial review if local people's views are not given the weight they deserve when deciding on the future of health services in the area.

Cllr Rob Waltham, leader, North Lincolnshire Council, said: "The proposals are clearly about saving money rather than what is best for local people.

"Improving services must be at the heart of any changes – the people of Scunthorpe and the surrounding area should get the best possible healthcare.

"Where there is a need for specialisms having a single site – and if better care can be assured – then the support mechanism for people accessing that care need to be in place."

Cllr Len Foster, leader, Labour Group, said: "Having attended three separate briefings from the Integrated Care Board (ICB) on behalf of the National Health Service regarding the transfer of services from Scunthorpe General Hospital to Grimsby I have, unfortunately, become more disheartened with each meeting.

"What is supposedly a consultation with North Lincolnshire residents is appearing more like a fait accompli. "This is a total turn-around by the NHS who not so long ago were talking up the possibility of providing a full 'Blue Light Zone' encompassing all health and emergency services but obviously not only has this been shelved but we face a possibility of a withdrawal of many services in Scunthorpe.

"Nevertheless, we need to ensure that this is not the beginning of the end or the death by a thousand cuts for Scunthorpe and I would encourage all local residents to express their dissatisfaction by engaging in the consultation – patients and their loved ones within the Scunthorpe area should not be forced to lose out on these vital health services."

The extraordinary meeting of the council was called after health bosses launched a public consultation, inviting residents to share their thoughts on proposed changes to the way some services are provided across Scunthorpe General Hospital and Diana Princess of Wales Hospital in Grimsby.

The 14-week consultation is being led by NHS Humber and North Yorkshire Integrated Care Board (ICB) – the proposals seek to provide some services solely from Diana Princess of Wales Hospital rather than across both hospitals, as is now the case.

The proposal being put forward relates to a trauma unit, overnight emergency surgery, specialist teams for heart, lung and stomach conditions and paediatric overnight care for children and young people who need to stay in hospital for more than 24 hours.

A final decision will be taken by the ICB Board in 2024.

The motion agreed by the council was: "This council strongly objects to the clinician-led proposals recently announced by the ICB regarding the transfer of some vital NHS services from Scunthorpe General Hospital to Diana, Princess of Wales Hospital, Grimsby. Transferring services to Grimsby would mean that patients and visitors would face additional transport costs which is an unnecessary barrier to accessing important health services.

"However, what is currently proposed can only be described as a major downgrading of Scunthorpe General Hospital and its services to the detriment of our communities, and will only benefit those who live in North East Lincolnshire and Lincolnshire.

"We will work with all local MPs and we will defend robustly the health needs of our children, families and older and disabled residents to protect our NHS services in Scunthorpe. The Council reserves the right to apply for a full judicial review should the outcome of the consultation and the resulting recommendations not be in the best interests of North Lincolnshire residents."



Three drop-in consultation sessions will be held; the first in Goole on 12th October, the second in Grimsby on 16th October and finally in Scunthorpe on 20th October.

These babies predictably need over 24 hrs stay, often requiring oxygen and support with feeding .

The psychological, financial and practical implications of families being separated from their children is going to be, without doubt, so disruptive.

Anyone who is familiar with the needs of a hospitalised child , knows the long term impact of not having their main care giver with them, can be detrimental.

Having to prioritise an ill child's needs against limited finances, lack of transport and family support, has the potential to cause delay, at worse prevent them accessing treatment, and so place the child's health at further risk. But ... as initially mentioned, I'm sure "the model" has taken all of that into account, hasn't it ?

COMMENT

XXXX well said this "model" would be disastrous for families in this area. Cost of living has rocketed with families frequently reliant upon food banks and cost of living support. Having to attend "warm spaces" because the cost of heating is financially crippling.

Our health and care system is facing unprecedented challenges. We face significant shortages of doctors, nurses and hospital support staff. Despite our best efforts, we can't recruit enough new staff or support our existing staff to keep up with the specialist skills required to provide the quality and safety our patients and staff deserve.

Our staff are spread too thinly across hospital sites, with relatively small services provided from a number of different hospitals. This means that we are not always able to meet clinical standards set nationally and that jobs for our staff are tougher than in other parts of the country.

Nearly a third of our staff are eligible to retire within the next 5 to 10 years. National shortages mean we still struggle to recruit enough skilled staff for our speciality services. Potential recruits tell us that roles are not attractive because low numbers of patients mean they can't keep up their specialist skills, and can limit opportunities for research, education and training.

As a result, vacancy rates in some specialisms were approaching 30% in 2022/23, leading to gaps in rotas which put pressure on existing teams and increasing our reliance on expensive locums and agency staff. This can make it harder to provide continuity of care for patients.

Last year (2022/23) we spent over \pounds 37 million on temporary (agency and locum) staffing to cover gaps in rotas to ensure services continue to be delivered safely.

We want to continue to provide the best care for those living in our region and invest in the many specialist services our hospitals provide. As a collective of hospitals working better, together, we can provide improved services and care for all. But to do so, things need to change.

XXXXX this is not about saving money. This is about providing the best clinical care and achieving the best health outcomes for our patients by making sure services are fit for the future.

We also expect this proposal to help us to use our financial resources in the most efficient way. For example, we expect the proposal to help reduce our reliance on agency and locum staff, reducing the 'premium' we pay in for these temporary staff and helping to improve continuity of care for patients.

The proposal also helps us to organise the staff we do have more effectively to make best use of the workforce we do have. For example, there are around 370 emergency overnight operations across in Scunthorpe and Grimsby. Across the two sites, this is about one operation per night, yet fully staffed 24/7 on-call rotas need to be maintained at both hospitals.

This is not an effective or efficient use of NHS resources. Bringing overnight emergency surgery together on one site would mean some staff who are currently on-call overnight could work during the day, providing more capacity overall.

COMMENT

Northern Lincolnshire and Goole NHS Foundation Trust so all out of hours emergency surgey gets moved over to DPoW...what happens when someone comes into Scunthorpe A&E with a ruptured spleen, or a bowel obstruction, or a perforated appendix and needs surgery ASAP? Only today I've had an Asian Nurse take my temperature and BP, she selected the wrong cup and then after using the wrong temperature device told me I had a body temp of 34.5 and walked away. A short time later another Asian Nurse returned and re took the readings, does this observation worry you as much as it did me? The NHS is falling apart and the existing whole business is failing the local community. The influx of foreign Nurses and other disciplines is not effective and the cultures and skill set in some cases is poor. People are your biggest asset and as the adage goes ' you can only piss with the dick god gives us. Standards are being watered down and the UK is losing its identity for the worse. The existing buddy and coaching of Nurses is a serious concern and it is clear from my stay in hospital the levels witnessed is a failure. Centralising facilities is not the fix it is sticking a plaster over an injury, you are not correcting the chronic failings.

XXXXX The vast majority of patients who use our hospitals would continue to be seen and treated in the same hospital they are now (around 400 a day who need urgent and emergency care and over 1300 a day with planned appointments or operations). Those who have a more complex medical need would be



treated at a different hospital (Grimsby) and would arrive in an ambulance or be taken by free interhospital transport after having received their initial medical assessment at Scunthorpe. The proposed changes – if implemented – would impact around 14 patients each day, who would be transferred to Grimsby (either directly by ambulance or by inter-hospital transfer after an initial assessment at Scunthorpe) to receive more specialist medical treatment. The number of patients affected is expected to be lower in the longer term as services adapt to new and improved ways of working.
