### 2.0 Committees Effectiveness Reviews 2023/24

A self-assessment was completed by each Committee, with the exception of the Integrated Care Partnership. For the ICP, a discussion instead, with a key theme emerging around wider partnership working and engagement. For the other 10 Committees, the self-assessment drew upon the Healthcare Financial Management Association (HFMA) Audit Committee Handbook Guidance.

The Board can be assured that overall, the effectiveness reviews were positive. Some consistent themes emerged and there will be a focussed piece of work in 2024/25 to support the Chairs and Secretariats in their roles and further embed the ICB committee governance arrangements.
