- The Partnership agreed for the Futures Group to develop a proposal for coastal-based 'living lab' research which is to be presented to the ICP in Spring 2025.
- The Partnership were asked to note the challenges regarding patient transport and the mapping exercise currently underway. A more detailed report is being developed.

- Integrated Care Partnership Update from HNY ICB regarding:
 - Impact the change of government including the publication of the Darzi Report, which aligns with the ICB Design for the Future workstream.
 - Focus on financial management and winter preparation.
 - ICPs role in promoting integration and working at Place.
- Local Government Partnership Update from Local Authority Representatives regarding:
 - o Budget-setting and preparation for devolution.
 - Public engagement with a focus on prevention and ensuring fair access.
 - Section 75 agreements with potential to direct resources towards local authority areas.
- Futures Group developing a 'living lab' research methodology involving coastal communities

focusing on longevity and ageing well. An ICP proposal is expected by Spring 2025.

- Place Update:
 - Collaboratives progress in empowering Collaboratives, with the Mental Health budget for 2025/26 allocated to the MHLDA Collaborative.
 - Workplace culture- discussions on changing workplace cultures, supporting staff, and focusing on key ambitions.
 - o **Integrated Neighbourhood Teams** highlighted use of collective resources, defining localities, and seeking consistent patient outcomes.
- **Design for the Future** highlighted alignment with the Darzi report including a strong shift towards community care and recognised trend of right-drift towards specialist care. Design will focus on how the public experience health and care, and what organisational changes are required to support this. Pre-engagement strategies are being developed.
- Integrated Needs Assessment highlighted the need to address health inequalities in coastal communities. Exploring common definitions of integration and measuring savings from released resources. Local models were highlighted as facilitators for producing data.
- Outcomes Framework measures will be both quantitative and qualitative, reflecting 5 priority outcome themes (cancer, CVD, frailty, MH, CYP) as well as the life course themes and their specific actions. The next steps involve refining measures and creating a logic model to link metrics for various strategic programmes. This includes adding inequality dimensions and incorporating feedback from those with lived experience.
- Transport and Travel:
 - Transport Mapping: VCSE Collaborative's mapping of patient transport services, noting spending and funding variations. Recognition that the VCSE play an important part in health-related transport services. A full report will be provided to a future meeting.
 - Patient Transport Services: work is underway to address increasing demand and varying eligibility criteria, with a focus on equitable access.
 - Opportunities: It was noted that Local Authorities also have transport resources and that Combined Mayoral Authorities will have responsibility for public transport.
