# **Q4 Governance: Committee Assurance Report**

## 1.0 Introduction

- 1.1 The report presents the key outcomes of the light-touch review of the ICB Board's Committees as part of the 2024/25 year-end processes. For most Committees, the review comprised three elements:
  - i) An effectiveness review
  - ii) An annual report
  - iii) A review of the terms of reference
- 1.2 Since the *Digital Strategy Committee* and the *Innovation, Research and Improvement System (IRIS) Committee* were disestablished during 2024/25, only an annual report has been produced for these committees, as the additional elements would have limited usefulness.
- 1.3 The *Digital, Data and Innovation Committee* was established in November 2024, and it is premature to conduct a full review at this early stage. The Committee will be included in the year-end governance processes for 2025/26.
- 1.4 A review of the North East Lincolnshire Joint Committee is being undertaken by the internal auditors.
- 1.5 The Board is responsible for approving any changes to its Committees' terms of reference and these will be brough to the Board for approval in May 2025.

- 1.7 The Committee annual reports will form part of the Annual Governance Statement.
