MP speaks of Hull councillor's testimony in support of Tobacco and Vapes Bill



Health leaders from across the Humber and North Yorkshire say they are thrilled to see the historic Tobacco and Vapes Bill move to the committee stage after an overwhelmingly positive vote during the bill's second reading in Parliament.

There was cross-party support for the bill, which also includes provisions to implement robust regulations for vaping to curb youth use.

The final vote saw 415 MPs in favour of the bill, with only 47 voting against it—20 fewer than those who opposed similar legislation during the bill's aborted passage through the previous Parliament.

During the debate, Liberal Democrat MP Helen Morgan explained her decision to support the bill, shifting from her previous stance of abstention. She credited her change of heart to a moving speech by Hull councillor, Linda Chambers, at a recent Parliamentary event.

Pathway Diagnostic Review



The NHS Humber and North Yorkshire Integrated Care Board (ICB) Clinical Effectiveness Unit (CEU) is committed to compiling all clinical pathways across interfaces to establish a single repository for clinicians.

This initiative aims to facilitate easier access to and utilisation of these resources. The pathways will be consolidated, serving as a comprehensive resource hub for clinicians.

There was a deep dive into the challenges and opportunities of one-to-one observations in packages of care which identified areas of opportunity for providers. There was also an update from the finance team looking at the challenging financial context for the marketplace.

Project aims to ease patient anxiety with virtual hospital tour



Patients and carers visiting one of Tees, Esk and Wear Valley NHS Foundation Trust's hospitals will soon be able to tour the site without leaving their own homes – thanks to a pioneering new scheme.
