Visit to Catterick Integrated Care Centre



Colleagues from NHS Humber and North Yorkshire Integrated Care Board recently participated in a site visit to the Catterick Integrated Care Centre (CICC) – a unique model of care which brings a range of health and social care services together under one roof.

The NHS and Ministry of Defence (MoD) have been working together on plans to enhance the range of health and care services for Catterick Garrison and the wider Richmondshire area.

The CICC is the first MOD-NHS partnership of its kind and will enable shared estate, expertise and learning to optimise the health and care services for people across the area.

[Inclusion health](#) is a term which is used to describe people who are socially excluded and typically experience multiple overlapping risk factors. Compared with the general population, people from inclusion health groups often experience very poor health outcomes and a lower-than-average age of death.

System partners from across the East Riding have worked together to develop this Champion scheme, supporting the ambitions of the [East Riding Health and Care Committee's](#) Inclusion Groups Programme which aims to improve access to and experience of services for inclusion health groups.

Construction begins on new Day Case Surgery and Imaging Centre



A groundbreaking ceremony to mark the start of work on a new Day Case Surgery and Imaging Centre for the Harrogate district has been held at Harrogate District Hospital.

The healthcare facility, which is being built by UK construction company Morgan Sindall, will provide additional capacity to meet the needs of patients waiting for surgery.

The ceremony, which took place on Friday 14 February and was led by Jonathan Coulter, Harrogate and District NHS Foundation Trust's (HDFT) Chief Executive, saw the first spades hitting the ground on the 18-month project.

The construction of the Day Case Surgery and Imaging Centre, which will be located on the site of the hospital's old Therapy Services building, is being undertaken as part of a £50 million capital investment funded by HDFT and NHS England, which has also seen the removal of reinforced autoclaved aerated concrete (RAAC) at the Harrogate District Hospital site.
