New joint healthcare centre to treat military and civilian patients in Yorkshire



A new cutting-edge healthcare facility in Catterick, jointly built by the Ministry of Defence and the NHS, will treat thousands of patients a year including the military, their families and the local civilian population in North Yorkshire and the wider area when it opens next year.

The Catterick Integrated Care Centre (CICC) which has received approximately £110 million of funding, is a first-of-its-kind health partnership, directly employing more than 300 highly skilled medical personnel from the MOD and the NHS to treat up to 1,000 people a day.

Situated within Catterick Garrison, home to over 14,000 military personnel, the centre will offer a range of services, including primary care, rehabilitation, mental health support, and specialist treatments. It will see military personnel, their families and the wider local population all treated at the same location.

The project aims to improve local access to healthcare, providing a variety of healthcare services in one location, and will also provide opportunities for training.

GP encourages people to be vigilant during hot weather



A GP is encouraging people in Humber and North Yorkshire to follow the guidance and stay safe this weekend after a hot weather alert was announced.

The UK Health Security Agency (UKHSA) issued a yellow heat health alert for Yorkshire and the Humber, beginning at 12:00pm on Friday 27 June and lasting until 6pm on Tuesday 1 July.

Although hot weather is welcomed by most people, when it's too hot for too long, there are health risks. In England, there are on average 2,000 heat-related deaths every year.

The heat is likely to impact vulnerable people most, posing a greater risk to life and putting increased demand on healthcare services.

Hospice patients asked to consider corneal donation, following national shortage



A national shortage of corneas to help people with sight loss has prompted St Leonard's Hospice in York to take action.

As many patients in hospice settings are eligible to be tissue donors upon their death, the York Hospice has launched a campaign to raise awareness of corneal donation, helping patients and their families to understand what this entails.

Nicola Fenton, Advanced Clinical Practitioner at St Leonard's Hospice, explained: "We know that more than two million people in the UK live with sight loss and some conditions can be treated with corneal donations. Around 5,000 corneal transplants are needed every year in the UK, so we want to help with this.

"Here at St Leonard's, we are working with NHS Blood and Transplant to encourage people to consider this as an option when they come to the Hospice."

Hull Royal Infirmary is to fly its organ donation flag to mark when a life-saving donation has been made.

Helen Russell, Joanna Pancarowicz, Janine Tate and Jane Langley, all Specialist Nurses in Organ Donation, have arranged for the flag to be flown outside the main entrance to the hospital when a family agrees to organ donation on behalf of their loved one.

Seventeen families have consented to organ donation since April last year after their relatives were declared brain dead or following their death from cardiac arrest, known as a non-heartbeating donation, at Hull Royal Infirmary.

More than 100,000 transplants have been carried out since the creation of the Organ Donor Register in 1994. However, the waiting list for a transplant is currently the highest it's been in an decade, with more than 7,900 people in the UK waiting for the call.
