The health and care board which oversees the NHS in Goole will be holding a second drop-in event about services in the town to give more people the chance to join in the conversation.

The NHS Humber and North Yorkshire Integrated Care Board, together with the Humber Health Partnership which runs Goole and District Hospital, is keen to reassure people about the future of the hospital, whilst giving residents the opportunity to talk about what is important to them and how they would like to see health services in the town developed and improved. People can attend the **Old Goole Working Men's Club, The Gables, Swinefleet Road, Goole DN14 5UN** to share their views about health services, find out more about future ideas, ask questions and get involved in next steps.

Throughout June, NHS representatives will also continue to talk to Goole-based community groups to gather feedback, and people can also access more information through social media.

Funding to help host T Level students on industry placements



Employers can now access funding to help with the costs of hosting T Level students on industry placements.

The Employer Support Fund is a targeted fund which can support T Level students starting their industry placements with you between 23 April 2025 and 31 March 2026.

The fund supports:

- All employers hosting <u>Health</u> T Level students
- Small and medium enterprises (SMEs) providing placements for all other T Levels

The system has proved to be so successful, a quarter of the Trust's Facilities workforce at Scunthorpe has now been recruited using this method – and some have already progressed into team leader roles.
